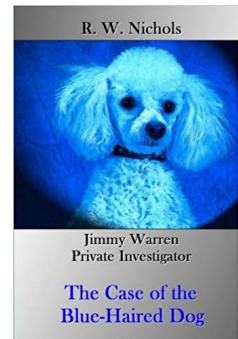
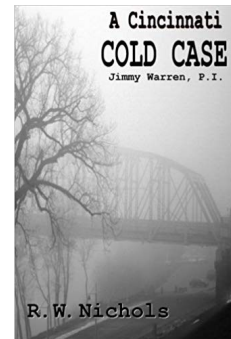


Books for Lunch

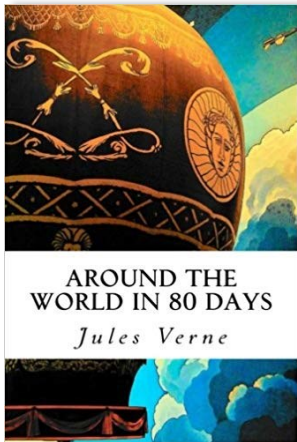

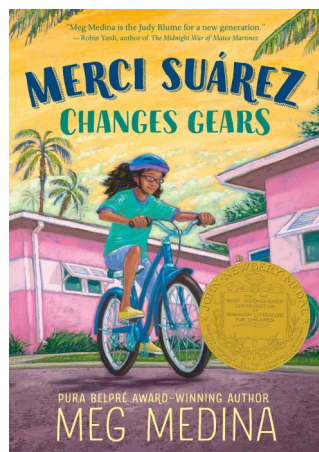
